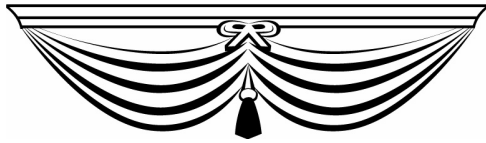

Badge Programs for Junior Girl Scouts

Nature as Inspiration: 19th Century Diversions

Program fulfills requirements for the *Outdoor Creativity Badge*.

This workshop includes a tour of the house and outdoor creative activities. Participants have an opportunity to sketch and write Haikus while the natural landscape, gardens, and breathtaking views of the Hudson River provide inspiration for their creativity. Time permitting, the scouts may wish to hike the Woodland Trail. (Trail maps provided.)

Spin a Yarn of Dyestuffs and Cloth

Program fulfills requirements for the *Yarn and Fabric Arts Badge*.

This workshop includes a tour of the house with emphasis on the textiles in the collection. The use of dyestuffs that are grown in the herb garden is also discussed. Participants have an opportunity to pick and card wool before it can be spun into yarn for clothing and coverlets.

What Paintings and Toys Tell us About the Past

Program fulfills requirements for the *Folk Arts Badge*.

This workshop includes a tour of the house with an emphasis on the portraits and paintings on display. Participants will have hands on portrait sketching opportunities, learn games and play with reproductions of toys of the early 1800s.

Fees

The fee for each workshop is \$5.00 per student.
One teacher or chaperone (per 10 children) is admitted free.
The fee for additional adults is \$8.00 each.
